In the master site I updated the component by uploading it and upgrading the component. There is only one instance that is correct in the master site.

Now I went to tools and selected the master site then clicked on the component and see COM\_K2. I clicked propagate to children and clicked 'overwrite' checkbox. I have a lot of sites and it looks to freeze for awhile, then it unfroze and then showed me that it had green checks on about the first 10 sites and failed on the next and quit. I tried it again, and it did all of them. However, now in the backend of all the subsites of SITE B, there are multiple instances of the K2 Component.

Can you please help? Also, when I did this, it overwrote my K2 items in the SITE B which is the master for sub-sites SITE B#, etc.

The fact that you have several instance of the "K2" in the menu let suppose that several entries were written in the website.

If you can not uninstall the extension and re-install it because you will lose the data, the only solution is to cleanup the "mnu" records manually in the DB.

Concerning the overwrite, you say in your post that you have selected the "overwrite". So this is normal that the content is replaced.

In PHPMyAdmin, you will find a table #menu where # is the table prefix. Inside this table, you will find all the menu entries.
Make a backup first and once you have a backup, try removing all the menu entries corresponding to K2 except the one that is active and that correspond to the extension ID that is installed.

Hi Edwin,
Okay so K2 has added a few records inside #components that I see in the master site. I do not see these records inside the child sites.
They have also rearranged they media folder in: /root/media/k2

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So every site is missing the new folders inside /media/k2 from the master site.

I selected "propagate" to children so why isn't it adding the records from jos\_components that it added in the master site?

What is happening, when my client goes to edit a k2 item on their site, it crashes the #\_\_k2\_items table. I have to manually go to phpMyAdmin and 'Repair Table' which will then fix the problem. This is happening on EVERY site! So I'm trying to get to the bottom of it and make sure all the tables are there and files are available.

Regarding the media folder, i know I can open and resave or change to symbolic link so that any subsequent changes or updates would be reflected in the sites. I can do that. But still the question remain what about the extra db records K2 is putting in #components?

I've been working on this all day and trying to track down the issue. I checked out the K2 component package and it has many folders and files. One of which is install.k2.php.
I looked inside this file and it ALTERs and makes changes and additions to the database and inserts some records.
But it seems this file does not get run when propagating to children sites. I reinstalled on Master and then went to JMS > Tools > Selected my master > K2 (propagate to children).
Thinking that it would take the component install files and run those on all subsequent sites. But it's not So how is JMS supposed to handle this?
What are my options??

The problem that you encounter is a problem in Joomla itself.

I tried to explain you the description of Joomla and how they save their information in the DB. The solution is to cleanup the record manually in the DB to remove the duplicate entrie.

Something that you can try is to uninstall K2 to see if it remain only one entry.

Perhaps this will help you identifying the "zombie" records present in Joomla and that cause you the issue.

It's like you don't read what I write! I'm not talking about the Zombie records right now. I can take care of those, but I'm talking about the upgrade to the component which runs a php file that alters the database and adds records for its new dropdown menu in the admin section. So it's adding those additions into the #\_\_components table. However, these changes don't get passed to children sites.

Is there a way to propogate and overwrite to only one site at a time? It would be nice to run tests before doing a mass change like that. I have test subsites but I need to be able to overwrite only that one to see how it goes before I screw all 150+ sites and my clients are mad. Is this something you can add? I don't see how to do it from the 'tools' menu.

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
