When you create a slave site, the open\_basedir must give the access to the slave site directory and the master directory to allow executing the PHP. So the forbiden access is perhaps due to that. What was the solutions?

My situation with the 1 and 1 and error, my build is older

I am hosting with 1 and 1 and just recently (23rd June) have experienced issues with permissions. First noticed - no access to the back-end of slave sites - 403 error, can login to front-end however the WYSIWYG editor and some component template and functions were no present. Last update was in March 2016, and sites all worked perfectly until the 23rd.

Running Joomla 1.5.26 php 5.5

1 and 1 suggested the (403) result from their recent Apache upgrade from 2.2 to 2.4

It gets worse - I tried a JMS upgrade to 1.3.61, unable to install the patches and can reverse the patches. Checked permission, read the forum, watched the videos. Maybe a cause from the original server issue.

My question(s) firstly, looking to troubleshoot permission issues with host. secondly, looking for guidance on how to continue: Move host and rebuild from back before the 23rd, scrap the existing JMS sites and rebuild (32 sites-yikes) on 3.+ joomla, or is there a way to salvage the sites where they are?

Any help and direction woud be greatly appreciated.

First you mentioned PHP 5.5 with Joomla 1.5.26

J1.5 is NOT compatible with PHP 5.4 or higher. So your problems may come from there.

Concerning the upgrade of apache, perhaps that you have statement in the .htaccess that would not be recognized.

To check if the problem comes from there, just rename it temporarly to "disable" it and verify if you still have 403 error.

Another potential reason is the "Mod Security" apache module that would be present in the server and that some security rule reject some call.

For your information, we create in 2014 http://ajmool2win.com that provide the update for J1.5 and we did a lot of fix for PHP 5.4 but we didn't rechecked it for PHP 5.5.

For your information we had to fix a little more than 11,000 PHP notice, warning, error to make it works. So if you want to continue working with J1.5, we suggest that you remaain with PHP 5.3 that is the latest one supported by Joomla.

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Tou also have to consider that the extension installed in your websites are perhaps also not compatible with PHP 5.4 or higher.

So just upgrade Joomla for PHP 5.4 or 5.5 will not be enough.

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
