The fact that you are runing under J1.5 is not the problem.
If you have added a slave site that inludes the master website in his list, effectivelly the master is become a slave sites.
2 possibilities: 1) Either you create a fake subdomain that point to you master "document root" directory. In this case the new subdomain will be used as the master because it is not defined as a slave site.
2) You disable temporarly JMS to fix the slave site definition and you restore it just after. To do that, you can add a file or a folder with the name /includes/multisites_disable.php
