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When I use <http://renewableshub.com> (with no "www" prefix in my slave url), I get redirected to the primary site. It's not a web host problem since I talked to my web host support team already. They say it could be Joomla Multisites.

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When you have defined the slave <http://www.renewableshub.com>, you have to add the synonym <http://renewableshub.com> in the JMS definition.

When JMS does not find the domain name into the list of domain defined in JMS, it automatically display the master website.

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The error message present in the snapshot means that you have defined your slave site based on a "website template" and in this website template, you use a "from" site id that does not have any configuration defined.

This explains why you have the error when you save the slave site and why JMS does not update its index with all the domain.

You should first fix the problem in the slave site used by the website template defined in your renewableshub slave site.

A work-around to force JMS to rebuild its index is to create another slave site (even a fake one) that you will save. When JMS saves any slave site, it rebuilds all its index and the <http://renewableshub.com> will be saved into JMS index.
