I just installed Multi Sites Google Analytics on the slave site and assigned it to Position Head assigned to Module Position Footer on all site. I installed the default on the master site, then went onto the slave site and used the discover tool to install there.
On the Master Site, it works perfectly. The code correctly appears in the head section of the site. However, in the slave sites the module is doing the following:
 Under Extension Manager: Manage > it appears and is published. Under: Advanced Module Manager > it is nowhere to be found. On the front end the code does not appear most likely because of 2 above.
