YES of course.  JMS is able to recognize the domain, the sub-domain AND the sub-directories.
For example we have customer that use sub-directories for the county or languages. So you can have http://www.domain.com/gb http://www.domain.com/fr and so on. Each "gb", "fr" can be defined as slave site in JMS and have their own content.
Some other customers use this structure for "dealers", cities, states, projects, and create specific websites for these sub-directories.
