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As you don't give any error message, it is difficult to tell the reason.

First we do not recommend to replicate the master website because JMS should not installed in the slave site and when you replicate it, it is also replicated in the slave site (that is not recommended). This is the reason why in our video we present the case where your main site in a slave site and not the master one.

If you want to replicate the master website to create a slave site, you just have to select it in the JMS templates instead of select the slave site.

You can follow the procedure described in the tutorial video 16 and just replace tpl\_master with the master DB.

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As I have told you the error "command denied to user" mean that your MySQL does not have enough privilege to share the MySQL user.

You have to increase the privileges of your MySQL user.

I don't know if you are using a hosting provider with cPanel or if you are using your own dedicated server, ....

but if you are not the MySQL administrator, perhaps you have to contact your hosting provider to grant the MySQL user and give you the permission.

This is a case explained in the tutorial video CP-02

If you have a MySQL root user that allow you increase the MySQL user permission, you can perhaps use the PHPMyAdmin interface to increase the permissions.

You have to provide the "CREATE VIEW and SHOW VIEW" permission to the MySQL user

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If you can confirm that you have the error message ""command denied to user" this is definitively an error with your MySQL user privileges.

You have to check that you have all the privileges.

If you are using cPanel, you will find at many places in the forum that cPanel has a bug that require to contact your hosting provider to increase the user permission manually (outside cPanel).

Contact your database administrator to increase the MySQL user privileges.

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Here is the solution for everybody to see. Create your databases...all that you will need (or 10 at a time) and add your user to each database with all privileges. Then contact your support and request that they add all the privileges for "View" to every database that has this user. They can usually have it done within an hour. This is the key to most issues.
