

Not getting an option for separate image/media dir

I'm running 1.2 now. However, in looking at the manual I see on page 16 I should be able to specify a separate media/image folder for each site? But those options do not appear when I create a new site. Instead I've found all the sites I've created so far allows each admin to add and delete files from the same folder(s). Not good!

How do I setup sites that have those 'shared' folders separate? Up till now I've deleted the images link in the new site and created a new folder, but things like jck editer or slideshow modules still use the global link (or seem confused where to find images) and when I upload a new picture to the image folder, they can't be found by the site's editor.

Any help would be appreciated.

P.S. I did create a template site that says to copy the media folder, however the images folder option is grayed out with "special copy".

As specific, to have a specific image and media folder, you need to replicate a DB because these setting are saved in DB.

Therefore if you don't define a slave site that consists in cloning a website, the parameters for the images and media folder are not available as explained in the tutorial video CP-05.

We suggest that you have a look in all video present in the tutorial.

They will help you understand the different concept of JMS and also how to use the JMS templates to define the replication rules.

Edit: Ah, ok.. I see. Separate DBs and I already have a "standard template" setup, but I wasn't putting in a prefix for the DB leaving it at JOS_ since it's its own DB already. Putting JOS_ popped up the options... Thanks for the help.

The problem to have access to the field for the image and media folder is that you need to replicate a website (use a JMS templates with a DB defined).

The video that describe this case is the CP-05.

As you will see, we create a JMS templates where it is defined the rule for the DB replication.

As explained in the video, to have those image and media folder available, you have to replicate a website. If you don't, those parameters are not available.

You can not specific those parameters when you create a fresh slave site.

Only when you replicate a website, because thoses parameters are saved in the DB.

By definition, when you create a fresh slave site, this mean that you will use the joomla installer after that you have asked to JMS to deploy the slave site. As JMS has not yet the DB info, it can not setup the DB and create special directory for the images and media folder.

Ok, now when I create a new slave based on a template and a new DB, the only files that get put into my site_dir are a templates folder (nothing in it) and "config_multisites.php", that's it.

The DB is populated with "Jos_" tables and according to Phpmyadmin there are records in various tables, so I assume that part worked. Just nothing was replicated into the site's main directory but those 2 files.

Please follow the video CP-05 and listen carefully all my comments.

This is clearly explained.

I suppose that you have entered the following values

Deploy folder = {site_dir}

Themes folder = {site_dir}/templates.

If this is the case, you have to check if you have symbolic links inside the templates directory.

Becarefull that some hosting server "file manager" tools might not display the symbolic links.

Same problem with some FTP tools.

The only way to be sure is to use a terminal application like SSH.

First check your tool to be sure that it can display the symbolic links

Starting with JMS 1.2.7, there is also an option to directly copy the content of the themes folder and not create symbolic link as explained in the user manual.

To change the option, you can go in JMS templates and in "files and folders" tab, you can change the replication action on the "templates" directory.

There are no sym links in those folders. I own the server so have full shell access to it. I'll re-watch that video again. Seems there are some not so subtle differences with those parms.

Like site_rel_dir and site_dir both say in the mouse over they are equivalent to multisite/site_id, so why have 2 options that do the same?

Your example in that video is replicating the DB and using an alternate tablename for each site (same db)? I'm creating a separate DB for each site using and using JOS_ as default.

under tools the new website appears under that replicated site as a branch, rather then at the root.

Ok, I figured out why the replication wasn't working. Sometimes it's the simplest things. There was a typo on the template of "{multisite}", missing an "s"! I guess there is no error checking when creating the symlinks and dirs as the save always returned that the website was created.

Anyways, the video you pointed to did help, but of course there are so many different ways to create a slave that it isn't exactly right. The video uses one DB and multiple extensions. Also during the video you mark the administrator folder with the "ignore" option, which of course was creating my sites without the admin back-end. It did give me enough info to figure out how to get separate media/image folders

which was the original question.

I've created several 'test' sites using different folders and options and it all seems to be working fine now.

Ok, sorry to resurrect my post. But it seems there is still something odd going on here. I am using the Slave replication method as you pointed out in the video above. My new sites all have their own starting images and templates folder.

However, JCK is still using the master website for its image directory. And I'm wondering if this is something JCK related. When I use TinyMCE as my editor and insert images I'm getting the correct folders under multisites/sitename/images. If I use JCK to upload an image it gets put in the wrong place and initially shows the image in the popup window, but as soon as it is inserted into the website the image goes to the broken state.

Does JCK need some patching I wonder?

My multisite config for images looks like this:

When JCE was propagated from the main template site it's component settings in the DB are:

imagePath=/multisites/xxdomainanamexx/images

flashPath=/images/stories/flash

mediaPath=/multisites/xxxdomainnamexxx/images

So while I can see the images, when they get inserted into the page JCE turns it into:

www.domainname.com/multisites/xxdomainanamexx/images/imagename

Which of course is going to fail.

When I changed the paths to read "/images", etc, now JCE is using the mainsite's image dir, but the link when inserted it becomes www.domainname.com/images! Seems there's some disconnect in the way JCE is using paths.

Where-as the button at the bottom of the editor works fine...

Concerning your DB, if you have asked to replicate a DB (not create a fresh slave site) then you should have a copy of all tables of the website DB.

You can also see the table create with the JMS tools -> tables.

Concerning your slave site directory, all depend the deploy directory you have specified in the slave site. If this is {site_dir} as you suppose to mention it, you should have plenty of symbolic links. Depending on the tools you are using to check the directory content, perhaps you will not see the symbolic links and let you suppose it is empty.

Use a real FTP tool like the one that we are using in our video to be sure it displays the symbolic links or use a SSH connection to access the files and folders and check their types (symbolic link or physical files/folders).

installed all the times.

Here I see that you have separated images directory.

So if your domain or subdomain is correctly defined in your hosting server to be located in this directory,
it should see this images folder.

You also have to check if you have installed the FCKEditor that were delivered in JMS patch 1.2.23.

The JMS multisite patch definition 1.2.23 contains:

- * a patch for JoomlaFCKEditor to allow the image manager used the slave site image folder and no
more the master image folder.
- * Improve the Joomla master "configuration.php" patch processing and detect double JMS wrapper
installed in the master configuration file.
- * Add JMS Tools (install) definitions for :
 - OpenX module

So when this is installed it patched the Primary website's FCKeditor, I'm not sure if that editor was

installed when the patch was issue. What version is used then to install for slave sites? I assume at that point we're just creating whatever DB tables are needed for the slave's FCKEditor and that the patched version is being used by all slave sites. So if FCKeditor has been uninstalled and reinstalled the patches will also be lost. Do you have a specific patch file or the patched version you can point me to?

Edit: Ah, ok. For some reason I've missed a few patch announcements too. I'm on 1.2.19.. Patching up now!

Ok, patched up to 1.2.25... JCKeditor still using master image for browsing, but when selecting a graphic *then* it uses the slave-sites image dir, which results to a broken image as selection and final are not the same location.... Sigh...

I also went into the Multisite manage page and went down to one of my websites and did a save, thinking that maybe there's something that needs to be propagated for the patch? Big mistake... Seems like every time I go to the manage sites page, then to a slave site, and change even one option, a save wipes out crucial info for that site.

In this case the site's template was lost and all my menus were reset back to the slave's template! At least the data was still there... Even reinstalling the template and selecting it as default, kept the site at the joomla default one. Almost as if parts of the website were not pointing to the proper place.

I ended up restoring from last nights backup which fixed things as it's a live site that I couldn't tinkering around with trying to determine what is going up. I used that site because I have a front-end user that needs to edit things and wanted them to use JCK instead of the TinyMCE...

I just can't grasp what is actually going on here. The docs don't really tel you much and re-saving a site shouldn't wipe out the site's data like that either!

I'm quite concerned about using this product forward. I'm a small ISP and use it so I don't have to worry about patching multiple sites when a security issue is found. But, this seems more geared towards master/slave replication of the same site?

Securing and permissions also has become an issue. I can't have all the sites run as one user, but since the permissions are all via symlinks Apache doesn't play well if I define the webistes to run under the actual website's owner as defined in the unix files. So letting them ftp up files/media stuff to their directories of course doesn't work...

Maybe this isn't exactly an ISP product for the purpose I'm using it for?

As I have replied several time, you need to have an images directory that is a symbolic link.
Second, you need to have the patch for FCKEditor installed.

I don't know why you destroy things.

Perhaps you have enable the FTP Layer and not setup the FTP root directory correctly.

Maybe there is a language issue here. I do not destroy things. I hit 'save' at the manage sites, and then your stuff destroys things.

You first said image directory has to be its own directory for the site to have its own images, but then you say it has to be a sym link???

Also while I was able to restore from a backup, now the Jevent_lastest module in the admin side doesn't not properly display. I'm getting the module without in options or CSS content. Did that patch do anything with JEvents? (version JEvents v1.5.3)

What exactly is patched with JCK? Can you provide the patch file itself rather then through your interface? It's hard to tell exactly what has been done (or not) now. All I know is JCKedit wasn't working, I installed up to 1.2.25, went into site management, made sure the folders had the right paths and hit save. Since then this site has been partially broken, I've had to restore it twice, and even then the admin interface side for Jevents Latest is not working. I've uninstalled and reinstalled Jevents too and that did noting..

Not too mention JCKEditor is still broke...

Thanks for your help.

Edit: Oh and no. I did not enable the FTP layer. I realize, being on the other side of the support fence before, it is very difficult to determine what has or hasn't been done and what your customer is trying to tell you when solving a problem that you can't duplicate or have any idea what is going on. But please be patient and try not to blame us paying users for doing something you may think was wrong. You can't code for every possible combo and that's what debugging is for...

Well I solved the Jevents issue and templates breaking.. Perhaps you can do a little error checking for existing directories and such when they are defined for the images folder. After looking closely at the config_multisites.php file I noticed templates path was incorrect, reading "site_id}/templates". Missing the "{"! wasted a few hours on that...

Still would like to know exactly what you are patching in JCKEditor so I can compare with what I have as that still has issues using the correct image directory.

It is not possible to provide patch for manual operation.

JMS read the current source and perform modification on it.

It does not replace the source with new files but edit and modify them on the fly.

This allow updating your extension when there is a security fix or bug fix.

After that you reapply the patch on the file and JMS will update the latest one.

Therefore, it is not possible to do it manually.

Create special test for the directories and so on is not easy as there are plenty of possibilities and platform. This is already very complex.

As I have told, we have a billable support that would probably help you faster to identify this issue.

As shown in the tutorial video, you have to check the directory structure when you create a slave site.

This a very easy method to verify that the website created use the expected directory structure that you want.

Thank you for your reply. I am familiar with how a patch file works. Can you provide that portion that modifies FCKeditor, it obviously did not work as intended. Do you provide a list of other 3rd applications that are patched in your process? This is somewhat critical. Supporting JMS multisites is one thing, patching 3rd party apps that may very well be installed later should have a method or resource available to site admins of exactly what they need to patch. As it is my FCKEditor is broke for all sites.

I'm curious though, if this is only provided by patches, how does one install FCKeditor after the fact? Sites admins are not always going to have that installed from the start, plus FCKeditor people may come out with their own bug fixes and certainly you shouldn't be expected to patch/support their application everytime this happens!
