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"adminstrator/components/com\_multiisites/backupXXXXX" So if you don't have uninstalled JMS, the directory should contain the original files of your system.

You have the "On Install" directory that is the backup performed the first time JMS were installed. The other backup directory contain the latest backup.

Another solution to restore all the original joomla file is to re-isntall a full version over the current one. This will automatically remove all the patches installed in joomla.

Only the patches for the specific extension will remain installed.
