All I can tell you is that in JMS, you can defined several JMS templates that correspond to a same group
So that when you go in the front-end to create the slave site, you have a combo-box where you can select which JMS templates you want. You can give them a title and a description.
Once the user has selected the JMS template then the website can be created.
This give your list of 3 choices.  Just create 3 JMS templates corresponding to each scenario.
