i received the message below:

- * The site 'site' is deployed.
- * You can now map your new domain

(http:///home/content/83/5356083/html/template/multisites/site) to the directory

- * '/home/content/83/5356083/html/template/multisites/site'.
- * When the DNS will be updated with your new domain (perhaps you have to wait 24 hours),
- * you will can go to your new domain and Joomla will request you a new installation (as usual).
- * Please use a new db prefix for each site and NEVER use 'jos' as prefix or if you want to keep 'jos' as prefix, create as many databases than you have sites.

when i went and checked http://mydomain.com/multisites/site

instead of showing a joomla installation. it was a blank page.

i checked the ftp and saw there was a file called: config multisites.php and a folder: cache
