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Edwin I have another feature request. This actually could be an add-on I would pay for immediately.

I have a component called "content enhancer" it allows for article variables, and global replacements.

What I would like it a multisite content variables component. When i can build a list of variables that I can place in data in my master. Then when i login to the slave i can go to the component and assign the value for the replacement in the slaves site content.

I would want this to work in many areas of content. Articles, MetaData, Titles, even something like

template mods. for google analytics or a hard link to my mobile site m.slave.com can be a global variable replacement.

so if you gave me a component that let me put in master value then place the {var} anywhere in the master i want then replace the slave value in the component it will dynamically change the content value.

Example. I make master site Mailing Address as my var. It makes me a {master\_add\_var} i place anywhere i need it, articles, meta, even templates. then in the slave i login to the component and replace master address text value to: 123 street

I know id need to make one for city, state, phone anything i want. but then i could edit values on my slaves all in one window quickly to deploy slave sites.

Let me know. I would pay for this.

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This extension already exists and is our free Search/Replace plugin

It does not work exactly like you explained but you can create Search/Replace list in a file on the disk and it is also possible to have specific list for each slave sites.

So you could configure the plugin a website that you replicate and always use parameters that are defined in a file on the disk.

So the user interface for the Search/Replace is not a Joomla component but a file (or several files) on the disk that you can manage with your FTP tool.

As this is a system plugin it works on all the elements of the page (modules, component, meta, ...)

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When you use the JMS tools, you can click in the checkbox to propagate to all the children.

So if you have adopted an architecture that allow propagate a same action to all the children then you can already do it.
