YES.

You have to remove all the Symbolic Links present in all the slave sites and rebuild resave the definition of each slave site to allow JMS rebuild the link with the new master website location.

You also have to delete the "index.php" and "index2.php" present in each slave sites to allow JMS rebuild them and update the path to your new location.

This is the same procedure as in the backup/restore procedure described http://www.jms2win.com/en/faq/faq-joomla-multi-sites#cat-122

If you move the master website from a location to another one, you have to verify all the slave site links to be sure that you update them with the new location.

You will have to delete the existing slave site links and rebuild them.

To rebuild the symbolic link, you just have to open the slave site in the new master location and resave its definition. This will rebuild the symbolic links.
