We NEVER succeeded to use this extension.

If you want to perform an accurate backup, see the alternate solution that we provided in our FAQ <http://www.jms2win.com/en/faq/faq-joomla-multi-sites#cat-268>

In theory, you have to backup the master to have a backup of the PHP code and the master DB backed. For the slave site, you should have to backup the deployed directory for the specific files and also their DB.

1/ i was successfull using akeeba backup with kickstart to do a backup/restore for migration from one server to another. I use one DB for master and slaves. I only share joomla, no other extensions.
2/ i had some problems but thx to the great support (even on sunday!!!) of JMS they were soon solved. I had to move all symbolic links, the index* files, installation map... Only cache, logs, template, tmp and 2 files about config were not deleted in slave sites. After this saving the slave site again in the master and everything solved!
3/ i am wondering too how to restore a slave site... i use akeeba in the master to make backups. in the slaves i make restore points before installing extensions. But i do not know what happens when i use this...

Concerning Akeeba, I am pleased to see that you successfully used it.

3) I can not tell you how Akeeba save the symbolic link present in the slave site.
I suspect that it will backup the files and folders corresponding to the slave site symbolic links. Normally, you should only backup the links and not the data.

Concerning specific Akeeba backup, I can just suggest you to ask Akeeba.
We never been able to use it with success.

This is the reason why you will find in the FAQ a procedure with a manual backup and also a shell script that allow performing a backup with native linux command.

2. created

- a sql-file and
- a tgz-file with the whole joomla-files

3. then I installed xampp (which works properly)

4. imported the sql and

5. extracted the "sites_12-Feb-2012-02h00.tgz" into C:xampphtdocs

But when I call "localhost" in the adress of mozilla I had plenty of errors

The symbolic link seems can not bee restored.
Verify that you have the directory reported in your list of errors.

If you didn't restored the backup in the same directory structure, this mean that you have to rebuild all the symbolic links as explained in the FAQ manual backup / restore procedure.

Apply the manual restore procedure as described in the FAQ.
And don't forget to rebuild all the symbolic links.

You can just upload small files and not PDF.

Concerning Artof User, it can not be shared.
So try using it with the sharing will not work.

I sent you the screenshot, to make clear that I backuped the whole directory structure 1:1.

3. If I backup the whole directory structure, aren't the symbolic links backuped as well properly?

Follow the FAQ for the restore procedure and you can rebuild the Symbolic Link once the physical file are restored.

I do not understand the answer. I don't have a ssh-access to my server.

4. Do you expect to rebuild all symbolic links after each backup?

"Check the content in the `"/multisites/config_multisites.php"`
Potentially delete the "master" cookies and master directory path.

5. What does that means? How delete? Where delete?

Delete all the symbolic links present in each slaves sites "deployed directory".

6. How delete?

(I don't have a ssh-access to my server.)

Delete the "index.php" and "index2.php" present in the root of each "deployed directory".

7. Why?

Don't forget to update you slave site definition to reflect the new path in case where you restore you website into another directory structure.

8. How do I upate?

9. When I copy the files from the server ".../web" to the local xampp "htdocs" 1:1 will this make a "another directory structure"?

I start regretting more and more to ever install jms ... :(
I looks that one has to become a specialist, just to have his files backuped - very weird!

10. Why can 't I just copy the stuff and that's it?

1) To verify is to restore like described in the FAQ.

First you should have all your symbolic link as they were defined in the environment that you backup. If you restore in another place, the link probably point to a wrong place and this is the reason whey in the FAQ we mention to delete all links and to rebuild them with the Open/Save slave site once you have updated your deploy folder for each slave.

2) Use a tool that certify to show you the Symbolic Link.

In example a SSH terminal with the "ls -l" command.

3) The Symbolic Link that are present in the directory that you backup are saved in the tar. So when you extract the tar, you retrieve the symbolic links.

The link are stored with the value of the "backup" environment and are not restored into a new location. The Symbolic Link contain absolute path and not relative path.

It seems that you restore with on a XAMP (Linux Machine). So you have a SSH terminal (console) available where you can enter command.

4) You just need to rebuild the Symbolic Link in the case where the backup is not restored in exactly the same directory as the original environment. This is your case.

The update of the "confi_multisites.php" is only required when you change of environment and path.

5) delete the line present in the "multisites/config_multisites.php" in case where you have changed of domain. Case where you restore on another machine with another domain name.

Delete a link like you do it with a FTP (when it shows the link) or with a SSH terminal command "rm filename_or_directory"
RM means in linux "remove"

6) Use a FTP tool that show symbolic link or use a SSH terminal that by definition allows you display the symbolic links.

7) If you don't update the "deploy folder" directory, you will try to rebuild the symbolic link with the original value (the one of your backup environment and not the one for the restore environment)

8) Go in JMS - Manage Site and edit each slave site.

9) NO. Read the documentation of the linux "tar -xvf".
This is like a zip and unzip.

10) You have to update all the Symbolic Link to reflect the new disk location.
All the path are absolute and not relative.
So they have to be updated (Action = delete follow by a rebuild)

All my questions refer to the text above - YOU answered refering the text below the questions.
The confusion is getting bigger and bigger ...

We had 3 hours live support for € 225,00 - so you should remember, that I, like 98 % of all users, work in a windows environment.
Besides, I mentioned it twice, that I DO NOT HAVE a ssh to do anything with the symbolic link stuff.

Sorry but I didn't remember that I did a specific support with you.
We can not remember the details of each customer.
This is because you mentioned it now, that you remember me that I did a specific support with you.

Windows and Linux is different and the restore on WAMP is not the same as XAMP
Linux has the symbolic link and windows NOT.

You explain that you have a local linux with XAMP.
Therefore, if you a local linux machine you must have a terminal consol and this is what I suggest to use.

If you don't have an FTP tool that is accurate to display the symbolic link, this is the only sure method that I know.

I don't known administration interface the you use with your local linux machine to do its administrator.

You mentioned Windows and XAMP.
For me this is not correct. Either Windows and WAMP or LinuX and XAMP.
As you mentioned XAMP, my answer is for LinuXXXXXX.

Perhaps you could try using the "Total Commander" application that has a FTP access. I know that with this tool, the symbolic link can be displayed (if your ftp server autorise it).

On a Windows platform, the Symbolic Link are not restored and therefore you can not use it.

The JMS settings on a windows platform is not the same as on Linux platform with Symbolic Link allowed.

If you want to use JMS on a Windows platform, you can NOT use the symbolic link and the slave site must be defined in another way.

Restore on a Windows platform the backup performed on a Linux platform that use the Symbolic Link require that you re-setup all the slave site to avoid using the Symbolic Links.

In Windows, each slave site "configuration.php" file must be located in the appropriate /multisites/{site_id} directories as the "deploy folder" can not be user (Symbolic Link not allowed). You also have to edit each config_multisites.php file present in each slave site to remove or rename the "deploy_dir" into "deploy_dir_deleted" and rename 'symboliclinks' into 'symboliclinks_deleted'

So that the deploy folder and symbolic link will be removed (as this facility does not exists on windows).

Once you have modified the "config_multisites", you should see the definition appears in the "JMS manage site" menu.

On a localhost, see also the user manual chapter 9 that show how to run on a localhost. You will have to add in the URL the `_host_=YOURDOMAIN` to simulate a specific slave site domain.
