

Hi,

I have installed the multisites component of version 1.1.12, where in we also found patch for jre\_cache component.

It is working fine if we manually create jrecache.config.slavesitename.php in administrator/components/com\_jrecache folder.

But jrecache.config.slavesitename.php is not creating automatically when we install com\_jrecache for a slave site from "tools" or when creating the new slave site.

Can you please give fix for this.

The JMS tools does not create such specific configuration files.

The JMS tools just update the DBs content to declare (install or share) the extension.

If you want to have a specific configuration file for each JRE, you have to go in the back-end of the slave site and go in the JRE configuration.

The JMS patches consists to write the specific configuration.

By default when the specific configuration file is not present, JRE will read the the "master" one.
