

## Ninja RSS Syndicator compatability

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Hi

I am trying to use the Ninja RSS Syndicator which seems to work fine, other than that the feeds appear to overwrite each other.

For instance:

produces the same feed as

[http://www.chippenhamlibdems.org.uk/index.php?option=com\\_ninjarsssyndicator&feed\\_id=2&format=raw](http://www.chippenhamlibdems.org.uk/index.php?option=com_ninjarsssyndicator&feed_id=2&format=raw)

even though they are produced by two different slave sites.

I recognise that this is probably due to the plug-in not being compatible with Multi-Sites so my question is:

- i) can it be made to work; or
- ii) is there a RSS syndicator that is compatible?

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Generally, RSS feeds call the website using the port written in the URL.  
Perhaps you have to add a synonym in the slave site that correspond to  
[workingforwiltshire.com:80](http://workingforwiltshire.com:80)  
and  
[chippenhamlibdems.org.uk:80](http://chippenhamlibdems.org.uk:80)

to avoid reading the "default" website (the master website).
