Please help.. I tried creating a slave site from a template 3 or 4 times. It comes back with no errors and no new site.. please advise..

The template just uses the master site, specifys the files and sharing for AEC and Jomsocial.

For the site I specified the ID, the domain name already made as an alias in Plesk, selected the template created above, specified the deployment folder.. already created, specified the the DB to put data into (also already created)..what am I missing?? How do I get it to tell me the error?

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When creating a slave site, you first have to check that you also have configured your hosting server correctly.

To help you check your hosting server (plesk) configuration, you can start install the hello world to check that you can call it.

Follow the tutorial step by step.

Which platform (unix, windows, ...) ?  
Does the symbolic link is allowed ?  
Which kind of server (Apache, IIS, ...) ?

If unix + apache + symbolic link allowed, you can start create your first slave site using the tutorial step 9, or CP-04.

Site ID = slave1  
Domain = {site\_url}/multisites/{site\_id}  
Deploy dir = {site\_dir}

This should create plenty of symbolic link and check that JMS is working with Symbolic Link.  
The advantage of this config is that it does not require to setup your hosting server (plesk) as this use your master domain name.

Start to create a basic slave site and apply the tutorial as they are presented.  
This will help you understand the concept of JMS

Once you will be able to apply the JMS tutorial sample, you could experiment your plesk configuration.

So before trying to create a JMS templates and replicate a website, try to create a fresh slave site to check your environnement.

In your description it seems that you are not able to create a fresh slave site as presented in the tutorial 9 or CP-04.

I am experiencing similar problem.

When creating site from Front-End (directly from ) site is not created no error is displayed

Also for some reason in Front-End button New redirect to front page (also without error)

Using linux, symlink is allowed, apache.

If i play with system (like reinstall it from scratch) it may start working and after some time (or immideatly after creating one site ) it doesn't

When i try to create site from Back-end, site is created but without symlinks - just those files

and it doesn't work of course

So you have to check the permission if the symbolic links are not created.

Perhaps you have error message reported on your server log.

Check also the tools you are using to check that symbolic link is present or not because some hosting server "file manager" tool does not display the symbolic links or display them as real directory that is wrong.

If it works during a short period of time after the installation of joomla and JMS, perhaps you have a CRON or similar task that check the permission of your directories or files and modify them that would cause the problem of permission after a period of time.

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ok i've figured this.

symlinks are not created because template was created when symlinks were disabled and symlinks were disabled because joomla config had relative path to tmp/logs and jms2win symlinks checking only works correctly with absolute path

"NEW" button and creating site in Front-End doesn't work because javascript of Save button is missing return false (submitbutton('saveSlave' );return(false) ;) (this is rather joomla bug but who cares)

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The submitbutton function is a present in the /includes/js/joomla.javascript.js that is normally added by your templates.

To test if this is your specific templates you can try to use the default joomla rhuk\_milkyway template. Perhaps this will help you confirm that the problem is located in the template.

Perhaps your templates does not have that allow to include the additional head informations.

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If you had that with the standard joomla template "rhuk\_milkyway", don't see what could cause the fact that "submitbutton" routine is not present.

We are not able to reproduce the scenario with standard joomla template and we have no problem.

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Well it appears to me, that without return(false) browser initiates standard form submission (in this particular case browser uses GET instead of POST). Don't ask me why browser interprets clicking on image as clicking submit button. On slow connections (like visiting site from opposite side of planet) that happens earlier than implemented custom form submission. Anyway if someone runs into same issue - now you have solution

I will analyze if it is possible to add the "return false;" but perhaps you could also report the bug to joomla team directly.
