now I have the ftp settings correct because they are the same as the ftp client I'm using.

the tmp folder is set to 777

When I hit the apply button a screen pops up quickly (I had to take a screenshot to read it.

We tried to login with the FTP parameters present in your configuration file and we were rejected.  
So check the login and password.  
When the login will be ok, perhaps you would have to check the FTP root directory also.

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Check your global configuration.php file and you have setup a FTP with url = "www.xxxxxx.us" and port 0

Normally the FTP port should be 21 and check all the FTP parameter with a n external FTP tool. When you are able to login with an extenal tool, consider that you don't have to do any operation or changed directory. If you have to change of directory, you also have to specify it in Joomla.

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
