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You probably created a "fresh" slave site does not not contain the "installation" directory that allow calling the "Joomla installer" to build the "configuration.php" file.

So verify that you correctly deploy the "slave1" into the directory corresponding to your server location. Based on your description, beside the master directory.

I also supposed that you are runing on a linux platform to allow deploying the slave site into another directory.

If you are runing under windows, you perhaps have to create a "virtual directory" to redirect on you master website directory.

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JMS Multisites does not create automatically the directory except when you enable the check box that ask to create the directory.

Here the message let me suppose that you have the "deployed folder" field available that means that you are running on a linux platform.

If you have this field available, just below, you have another field (check box) that you can enable to request creating the directory when not present.

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This probably mean that you didn't have the "installation" directory present in the "slave1" directory.

Normally, it should be present or you have deleted the "installation" directory in your master.

The installation directory is required to call the "Joomla installer" that is in charge to create the "configuration.php" file with the paramters for your website.

In this case, both the installation directory and the "configuration.php" files are not present.

In master site just i have renamed the installation directory like "\_\_installation" before installing the multisite component. But after creating the multisite I can see the installation directory into that (master) folder but site is running, it's not showing the error message like "Please remove your installation directory completely".

In slave site installation directory is available but configuration.php file is missing. While making the templates for slave site I have choose the "copy folder with subfolder links" for intallation directory as per the video tutorials.

How to resolve this kindly assist me.....

Once the Jms Multi Sites patches are installed, the "installation" directory is restored to allow creating new "fresh slaves" sites.

Jms Multi Sites is able to make the distinction between a "configuration.php" file that is not present and that require the "installation" directory or the case where the "installation" directory can be ignored.

We didn't changed the "Joomla Installer" to change its message.

When you click to start the "site" or the "admin", when the patches are installed, it can be started immediately without removing the "installation" directory.

Do not delete the "installation" directory that is present in the master as it is used when creating "fresh" slave sites to allow them launching the "Joomla Installer"

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Jms Multisites never create the directory except when you enable the check box that ask to create the deployed folder.

The "/multisites/{site\_id}" is the location where JMS Multisite saves the definition of a slave site. So in this case, it already exists as it is created by JMS multisite to save its data. In most of the cases, I have used this directory in the sample to avoid creating a new directory.
