YES it is possible to define domain with https

You just have to setup your Plesk correctly and provide the appropriate permission.

Plesk is not easy to configure and may require several hours to setup a domain or subdomain correctly. As each Plesk installation is specific, it is not possible to create a document or a video that give the procedure to setup Plesk correctly.

The only thing that we can suggest you is to contact your hosting company and read the Plesk help appendix II that explain how to setup specific vhost.conf in case where you need to fix setting in the Plesk default configuration provided by your installation.
