

Password not changed on admin during slave create

Following Configuration:

Multisite - 1.2.75

Patches - 1.2.77

Joomla - 2.5.1

php - 5.3.10

Steps:

When I created the template I selected a user as the Admin, that user had administrator rights

Used the template to create a new slave site

Changed the email address and password for the user during the slave site creation

Both the email & the password were still the original in the new slave site

BUT the email and password changed on the user in the master site's database

Tested this on back end only.

As you can read in another post where we replied to a similar question, the update is performed on the "admin user" that you have selected and if you didn't selected any user, the update is performed on the first "Super Admin" user that is find in the DB.

So select an "admin user" on which you want that the new login, email, password is applied.

I did select an admin. I specifically created an admin user to use for this testing and selected in the template that I used. I verified this multiple times on 1.2.75 and it consistently did not work as described below.

I'd select the admin in the template

When I created the slave site the users would be identical to how the "were" in the master site before the slave creation even though I changed the email and password.

After the slave creation, the admin user selected during the slave creation on the "MASTER" site changed to the new email & password

After I upgraded to 1.2.76 it updated the email and password on both the slave site AND the master site

I don't think the change on the master site is expected.

This is all being done from the backend

Dear Edwin,

I think this topic carries on, as password is changing when the user gives on the frontend, but I would like utilize the option provided in the template, where I can give:

- New Admin full user name
 - New Admin user login
 - New Admin email address
-

-New Admin password

I think if I fill these fields with variables as you see on the attached image, then there is no need to force the user to give any of these information. I think the new slave site's administration user should change to the user who created the slave site on the frontend. Am I wrong?

I tried to fill the template that way, that I have left full user name and user login empty and only gave {user_email} and {user_psw}. This way, I guess the site administrator names should remain, but the password and email should change to the user, who created the site on the frontend.

If I am wrong, what are these fields for? If I am right, then I think there is a bug here.

I would be happy if you would answer this topic of mine as well.

You mentioned an attached image but I don't see it.

Which are the value that you assigned in the JMS Template rule.

Don't forget that you have to select an "Admin User" that you didn't listed.

If you don't select the "Admin User" where you want to have a new full name, new login, new email address, new password, in this case, this update the first Super Admin present in your website.

The value does NOT change the user who created the website but change the selected "Admin User" that you defined.

Dear Edwin,

I understand the process, so of course I have defined the admin user as well. That's why it works when the user who creates the site has the option (allowed in the menu) to change admin e-mail and password. It works well.

But if I disallow to change admin password and email in the menu, and I want to let to create it via the template rule, it doesn't change.

It seems that I have forgotten to attach the template setup image, so I do it now. You can see on the template how I do it.

JMS always change a user.
When you don't select any admin user, JMS use the default rule that consists to update the first Super Admin user.
So it changes something but probably not the one that you want.

In your screenshot, it seems that you set an "Admin User".

I also notice that your path to image folder and path to media folder seems to be wrong.
You have to use relative path and not full path.
Are you using the latest JMS version ?

What is the difference using a relative path or an absolute path?
They are not pointing to the same directory in this case for example?

The difference between absolute path and relative path is that in case of the absolute path, this starts from the root directory of your disk (/)
In case of a relative path, this starts from the current directory - So relative to your deployed directory.

Concerning the Administrator user selected, the parameters that are defined in the JMS templates are used as default values to fill the new admin values.
They are used when there is nothing entered in the front-end.

exactly that is what I am saying, the new administrator parameters should be used when there is nothing entered in the frontend. As I have written earlier, I have DISABLED providing admin e-mail and password at frontend. See:

But if i disallow to change admin password and email in the menu, and I want to let to create it via the template rule, it doesn't change.

That is the problem. No admin e-mail and password is given at the frontend (as disabled), but the template provided options don't do their job.

No, I don't want to have you to look at my site for your billable support.
But I want fixing existing bugs and clear documentation. That is what I want.
Neither I want you give anyone my FTP access.

The "password and e-mail not changing" issue exists, that is what this topic is about. You solved a part of it, as it works if new admin e-mail and password are given in the frontend. It works for me as well. But if I give rules in template as in my earlier attached image, it doesn't work.

On the attached image earlier you can check whether I have given any wrong parameters for user/email/password or not. I guess I didn't.

If you cannot reproduce the issue, please make a tutorial about it, what is the way right doing it, if I make wrong something. It will be useful for others as well. You should show me how your product work not me finding it out, then asking whether it is good or not.

Making a clear documentation is your obligation as getting it is my right. I don't think that Joomla software development is an exeptions in EU consumer protection regulations concerning having or missing users manual.

I wasted many days because of your missing documentation and getting angry you are asking me paying because of your deficiencies. You are a EU citizen, your company is in the EU, how do you dare asking me paying for support meanwhile your missing documentation doesn't fulfill any EU consumer law regulations?
