In fact, when you are sharing something, the TABLE is replaced by a VIEW. So when a rule in MySQL execute a "table" command" instead of a "view" command then it report such error. This may means that you have a structure of the "physical" table that is changed and may affect the current view. In general, you have to drop the view and rebuild it with and "Open/Save" of the slave site. Remark: when you do an Open/Save, this also may install extensions when table are missing. So use the JMS Tool to check which table and extension may be also added (installed).
