

## Multisite and apache configuration

I create a slave site for this URL

<http://blog.cvo-cyberconseil.com>

I change my apache configuration in order to create a new virtualhost

ServerName blog.cvo-cyberconseil.com  
DocumentRoot /home/joomla/multisite/multisites/blogcvo

It seems to work when I connected to the site. But when I connect to the administration site  
URL : <http://blog.cvo-cyberconseil.com/administrator>

All the changes are written to the wrong database (the master). I'm using a single database configuration  
(master & slave in the same Database) The master prefix is multi and the slave prefix is blogcvo. All the  
table for blogcvo exists.

What's wrong with my configuration ? Why the administration site uses the master database and not the  
slave

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First you can check the apache configuration with the "hello world" procedure.

The idea is to install the hello.txt and hello.php file in the directory  
/home/joomla/multisite/multisites/blogcvo

If you see this file correctly when using the blog.cvo-cyberconseil.com domain name, this means that the  
apache virtualhost is probably well configured.

The second point to check is to verify you have spelled the domain name in the slave site definition that  
you have entered in JMS.

When JMS does not find the domain in the list of websites, it automatically displays the master website by  
default.

You also have to check in JMS that you have deployed the slave site into the directory  
/home/joomla/multisite/multisites/blogcvo

ps: I also speak French so that may help you.

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
