First you can check the apaches configuration with the "hello world" procedure.

The idea is to install the hello.txt and hello.php file in the directory

/home/joomla/multisite/multisites/blogcvo

If you see this file correctly when using the blog.cvo-cyberconseil.com domain name, this mean that the apaches virtualhost is probably well configured.

The second point to check is to verify you have spelled the domain name in the slave site definition that you have enter in JMS.

When JMS does not find the domain in the list of website, it automatically display the master website by default.

You also have to check in JMS that you have deployed the slave site into the directory /home/joomla/multisite/multisites/blogcvo
